Scheme of Examination:

1. Each theory paper EoSE shall carry 100 marks The EoSE will be of 3 hours duration. Part 'A' of the theory paper shall contain 20 Multiple Choice Questions of 20 marks, based on knowledge, understanding and applications of the topics/texts covered in the syllabus. Each question will carry one mark for correct answer.

2. Part "B" of paper will consist of four questions as suggested below except in cases where a different scheme is specifically specified in the syllabus

First question will contain 6 parts out of which four to be answered carrying weightage of 5 marks each. Word limit for each answer will be 50-70 words.

There shall be 3 questions (with internal choice) of 20 mark each. The word limit for each answer will be 1000 words

3. Each laboratory EoSE will be of four/six hours duration and involve laboratory experiments/exercises, and viva-voce examination with weightage in ratio of 75:25.
